Key interventions for reducing cancer mortality are reducing smoking, obesity and increasing uptake of healthier foods, as well as increasing uptake to screening programmes, early referral and diagnosis and effective treatments. <b>Current Activities/Projects:</b> The NHS Bowel Cancer screening programme, commenced in April 2008, continues to be promoted vigorously and has proved successful in detecting a number of cancers and polyps.
